Nomination

This is the highest award made by our Multiple District and is given in three categories: Lion, Lioness, and Leo. All information regarding this award can be found in the MD19 Roster under the Contest & Awards section. A nomination form will be mailed to each District Governor during January of his/her year.

Deadline

The written resume by the Governor must be in the MD19 office by April 30th. The Contest & Awards Committee will make the final selection.

Presentation

The MD19 Contest & Awards Chairperson will present this award at the District Governor's Banquet Saturday evening at the Annual Multiple District Convention.

Deadline

The written resume by the Governor must be in the MD19 Office by April 30th. The Contest & Awards Committee will make the final selection.

Presentation

The MD19 Contest & Awards Chairperson will present this award on Saturday at the Closing General Session.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD RULES

This Award shall be given to a Lion, Lioness with five (5) or more years of service and to a Leo with two (2) or more years of service in the Multiple District. The Distinguished Service Award for Leos will use the Leos Lions International Form as required. The winner of the MD19 Leo Distinguished Service Award will be the MD19 nominee for the Lions Clubs International Leo of the year Award. The recipients of these awards shall be selected by the Contests and Awards Committee **BASED ON WRITTEN RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE DISTRICT GOVERNORS. THESE RECOMMENDATIONS ARE TO BE RECEIVED BY THE MD19 CONTESTS AND AWARDS CHAIRPERSON AND THE MULTIPLE DISTRICT 19 OFFICE BY APRIL 30TH.** If the Contests and Awards Committee receives no recommendations or those received do not qualify, the MD19 International Awards Screening and Prioritizing Committee will choose a recipient.

The Nominations should include the following factors:

1. Effort and accomplishment;
2. Ideas carried out to completion;
3. Continued work on behalf of the Multiple District; and
4. General service in behalf of Lionism.
